

GOD CARES HOW WE EAT THE LORD'S SUPPER

God has always been interested in the worship humans offer to Him. We learn this from Cain, Abel, and even Jesus (Genesis 4; John 4:23-24). When we eat, marry, divorce, and worship, we must ask what God permits us to do.

From the beginning, Christians assembled to *break bread* (the Lord's Supper) in remembrance of Jesus' death on the first day of the week (Acts 2:42; 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:23-26).

Jesus gave *this bread* to represent His body. Thus, we have no permission to eat cookies or potato chips to remember His body (Yes, things like that have been done and are sinful).

Jesus also said that *this cup* (grape juice) represents His blood. May we mix some Sprite with the juice, to alter the flavor? No. Worship is aimed at pleasing God, not us!

The disciples met and ate on the first day of the week (the day of Jesus' resurrection). Just as God gave no permission for other breads or kinds of drink, where is God's permission to eat this memorial on another day or to assemble on that day but not break this bread?
